PE Leader to audit resources and questionnaire staff. Complete Action Plan.	Supply costs £400	Training provided for teachers where appropriate Curriculum planning enhanced.
PE SLE deployed to audit PE equipment	£350	Health and Safety in line with requirements. Equipment utilised effectively.
Promote PE and Sport at playtimes by investing in playground equipment : small games equipment and climbing wall	£4000 and £1500	Climbing wall used at all playtimes and small games playtime equipment organised and used well. Children active and engaged promoting healthy living.
Purchase equipment for PE lessons to develop the curriculum offered	£500	Improved resources for teachers to make cross curricular links in dance.
Dance Inset delivered to whole staff	£60	Dance Inset from leading expert.
Release teachers and TAs to take children to additional enrichment sporting events	£500	Children involved in a large range of sporting activities off site
Pay staff to run a 'Change for Life Club'	£500	Children less enthusiastic to take part in sporting activities engaged in active games at playtimes and lunchtimes
Subsidise the cost of some after school clubs to allow more children to participate in sport (this was a factor that was identified as a reason why some children do not attend additional sports clubs)	£200	More children from a range of families engaged in after school sports clubs (see parent questionnaire results)
Provide enrichment activities for children to inspire them to enjoy school sport	£500	Children engaged in a range of different sporting opportunities, motivated to join sporting clubs outside school.
Provide schools PE kit for teams competing out of school	£160	Children feel proud to represent the school at sporting events and are confident and motivated to do their best
