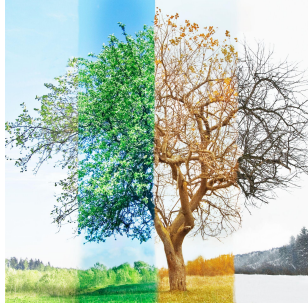

Giraffes Year 1 - Autumn 1 Curriculum Overview

Welcome to Year 1 with Mrs Wander and Mrs Evans.
Our topic is **Welcome to Wimborne** and we will be learning:

Home learning will be set on Google Classroom weekly.
Thank you for reading daily with your child.

English

Key texts: The Three Little Pigs, Mr Wolf's Pancakes.

We will:

- Develop confident formation of lowercase and uppercase letters and numbers.
- Understand the elements of simple sentences, including capital letters and full stops.
- Identify characteristics of fairy tales and traditional tales, finding similarities and differences between them.
- Plan and make plays from stories, using clear voices and props.

Phonics

We will:

- revise previously taught sounds and common exception words.
- add suffixes (-s, -es, -ing, -ed, -er, -est) and the prefix un-.
- name the letters of the alphabet in order.

Science

We will:

- investigate using our senses of sight, touch, smell, taste and hearing and know which body part is associated with each sense.
- make observations, predictions and ask questions.

Mathematics

- We will be working with 'Maths – No Problem!' to develop our depth of understanding, fluency and confidence in mathematics.
- Counting and ordering to 10, accurately, forwards and backwards.
 - Read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words.
 - Comparing objects, using terms 'equal to', 'more than', 'less than'.
 - Exploring number bonds to 10.
 - Developing strategies for addition and subtraction within 10.

Physical Education

We will develop our Fundamental Skills to move confidently and safely in a variety of ways. Please bring **P.E. kits** at the start of the week for us to get changed on **Wednesdays** and please wear **Forest School** clothes on **Mondays**.

PSHE

We will:

- know our class rules and their importance.
- elect and vote for Worship Team and School Council.
- learn more about what it means to be 'HeartSmart'.
- explore emotions, feelings, values, healthy minds and healthy and hygienic bodies.

Computing

We will:

- understand what is meant by technology.
- discuss examples of technology both in and out of school.
- learn to use Chrome Books, including logging in, using the trackpad and simple features.

Religious Education

We will be developing our understanding of what religious stories teach us, focusing on the Christian story of Creation.
Our value for this term is **Thankfulness**.

Art

Focus artist:

- Kandinsky.
- mix primary colours.
 - use range of media, materials and brushes.

Music

We will identify the mood of music, listen to and learn songs, begin to compose and perform and create simple notations to represent sounds.

History

We will discuss changes over time and the past, with a focus on Tim Berners-Lee (the founder of the World Wide Web) as a well-known person who lived and worked in our local area.

Geography

We will look at the globe and maps to find England and Wimborne. We will discuss the features of a town and draw our own maps.



These are sent every half term to give more detail about what we are learning in each subject.



Timetable

Every day: Phonics, English, Maths, Worship, Story Time

Weekly: Guided Reading, Computing, History, Geography, PE, Science, RE, Music, Art/DT, PSHE.

Every week until Christmas: Forest School.

- Fluency.

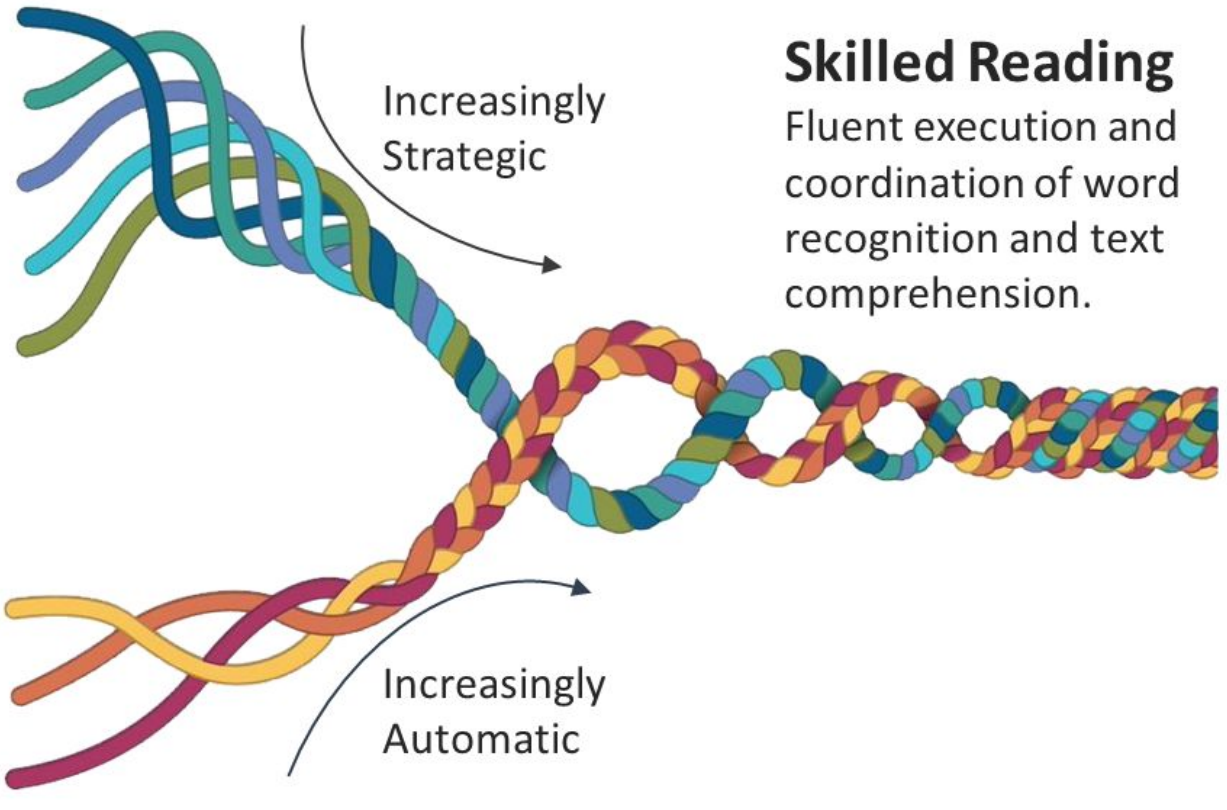
Reading



- At St John's our aim is for children to '**read to learn**' and '**read to enjoy**' therefore children will have two books – one to practise essential reading skills and a second book from the library that you can share together.
- Reading book and library book changed weekly.
- Aiming for independent decoding but also fluency, comprehension, expression.

Phonics



- Phonics continues and becomes an even greater focus in Year 1.
- We will learn the alternative spellings, for example:

ai -> **ay** (play), **ey** (prey), **a_e** (cake), **ei/eigh** (eight),
a (acorn), **ea** (break).

- There is a statutory Phonics Screening Check in the Summer term.
